After serving in the Office of Parliamentary Counsel, Canberra, in Australia and taking up different teaching posts in the Australian National University and Queensland University of Technology in her earlier career, Ms Johnson joined the Office of the Queensland Parliamentary Counsel (OQPC) in 1991. During her more than 20 years' service in the OQPC she took up a number of senior positions and advanced to the head post of the Parliamentary Counsel in 2010.
