Lord Woolf is a former Law Lord, Lord Chief Justice of England and Wales and Master of the Rolls. He also sat as a non permanent Judge of the Hong Kong Court of Final Appeal. He was Chairman of the Council London University, UCL where he was a visiting lecturer and fellow, the Open University Israel and is an Hon Fellow British Academy, Royal Society of Medicine, the Institute of Medical Science and the Hong Kong Chinese University. He now conducts his practice as an accredited mediator and chartered arbitrator from Blackstone Chambers, Temple London. In 2007 he founded and became the President of the Civil and Commercial Court and the dispute Centre in Qatar (retired 2013). His report Access to Justice (1999) radically transformed Civil Justice in England. He was the Chairman of the Woolf Inquiry into *Ethical business conduct in BAE Systems* (2008), more recently he chaired the Woolf Inquiry into the LSE's links with Libya (published Oct 2011), followed by publication of his report on 1 February 2012, An Independent Governance Review of the International Cricket Council with Price Waterhouse Cooper. He then assisted in conducting a review into the justice system of Israel. He is an active member of the House of Lords and President of the Prison Reform Trust and Patron of many bodies including the Woolf Institute at Cambridge for the study of Christian, Jewish and Moslem Relations. He is an editor of DeSmith Judicial Review (5th, 6th and 7th eds) and Woolf and Zamir the Declaratory Judgment. He has Lectured on Mediation in many countries.
