Mediation Essay Competition 2022

Mediation: Constructing a Harmonious Community (調解: 構建和諧社會)

Rules

Background

- 1. The Department of Justice ("**DoJ**") spares no effort in promoting the use of mediation as an amicable means to resolve disputes in various sectors. To encourage students to develop a positive and constructive mindset in dispute resolution, the Mediation Essay Competition 2020 and the School Mediation Seminar 2020 were successfully held for students to share their views on mediation. Riding on the success last year, the DoJ, the Education Bureau, Asia Conflict Resolution Institute Limited and Rotary International District 3450 will join hands again to coorganise the Mediation Essay Competition 2022.
- 2. In line with the Competition 2020, the Competition 2022 aims to raise awareness on the use of mediation in daily lives to resolve conflicts, whether in school, at home, in business context or in general. It is hoped that through the Competition 2022, students will appreciate the importance and the usefulness of mediation skills as life skills in resolving conflicts amicably, which will be vital to maintain personal relationships and ultimately construct a harmonious community.

Eligibility

3. The Competition is open to students attending local secondary schools or at equivalent grades at international schools in Hong Kong in the academic year of 2021-22.

Division

- 4. Entrants at the Competition will be divided into:-
 - (a) the junior division (Form 1 Form 3 of local secondary schools / Grade 7 Grade 9 of international schools); and
 - (b) the senior division (Form 4 Form 6 of local secondary schools / Grade 10 Grade 12 of international schools).

Requirements on essays

Theme

5. The theme of the Competition is Mediation: Constructing a Harmonious Community (調解: 構建和諧社會).

Topic

6. Entrants may write on any of the below suggested topics in either English or Chinese:-

(a) Mediator as a peacemaker和平使者調解員(b) How to resolve peer conflicts with以調解排解朋輩糾紛

mediation

(c) Active listening and dialogue積極傾聽及對話(d) My mediation story我的調解故事(e) Hong Kong as a mediation base調解基地在香港

(f) Why mediation is good to resolve conflicts 為什麼調解有助排解衝突

(g) Win-Win outcome 雙贏局面

7. Entrants may also write on any other topic of their choice which is related to the theme of the Competition.

Format

- 8. The essay must be:-
 - (a) written in either English or Chinese;
 - (b) around 500 words for junior division / around 900 words for senior division (including footnotes);
 - (c) in "Times New Roman" (for English) or "新細明體" (for Chinese) font with normal margins, double-spacing and a font size of 14 for text and 12 for footnotes; and
 - (d) in searchable PDF format with file name "[Student's full name]_Mediation Essay Competition 2022".

Submission of essay

9. Each entrant may only submit one essay (either in English or Chinese) for the Competition. To avoid any ambiguity, each school is allowed to have more than one entrant.

- 10. The deadline for submission of essay is **5 pm on 31 July 2022**. Late submission will not be accepted.
- 11. All essays shall be submitted via email to **mediation_essaycompetition@doj.gov.hk** with the completed Enrolment Form (see **Annex**)¹ in Microsoft Word format as two separate attachments. The email subject shall be "[Student's full name]_Mediation Essay Competition 2022".

12. To ensure fairness in assessment, no name or mark or otherwise any other identifier which would enable the identification of the entrant and/or his/her school should be shown on the submitted essay. All submitted essays will remain anonymous when being assessed.

Assessment criteria

- 13. Essays will be assessed according to the following criteria:-
 - (a) relevance to the theme of the Competition (30%);
 - (b) use of language, structure, style, succinctness and clarity in presentation (30%);
 - (c) originality (20%); and
 - (d) creativity (20%).

Adjudicating panel

- 14. The essays will be assessed by an adjudicating panel ("**Panel**") comprising professionals from the mediation, legal and/or education sectors.
- 15. The DoJ reserves the sole right to select the Panel members.
- 16. The Panel has the final decision on the results of the Competition and the absolute sole discretion in respect of all matters relating to the Competition, including the assessment of the essays.

Winners, prizes and award ceremony

- 17. There will be around 15 winners in each division, i.e. around 30 winners in total. In each division, there will be a champion, a first runner-up, a second runner-up and a number of merit awards.
- 18. The result of the Competition will be announced around <u>September 2022</u> on the website of the DoJ. Winners will also be separately notified.
- 19. Every winner will receive a certificate and a book coupon.
- 20. The champion, the first runner-up and the second runner-up in each division will be cordially invited to share their views on mediation, which can be based on their essays submitted for the Competition, at the award ceremony tentatively scheduled in **Q4 2022**.
- 21. Winning essays will be compiled and published as a book. All winning essays will be subject to editorial changes without prior notice at the absolute discretion of the Panel and the DoJ.

Intellectual property rights

22. All essays or any part thereof must be original and of sole creation which has not been issued

- or published, or submitted to other competition(s) before. The essay must not infringe the intellectual property rights of any third party in any way.
- 23. All essays will be subject to examination on originality and plagiarism. If a winning essay is found to be non-compliant, the DoJ will take all appropriate steps, including but not limited to forfeiting the prizes awarded without any liability to the winner or any other persons, and other essays may be assessed as the winning essays.
- 24. All intellectual property rights of all submitted essays will be regarded to have been vested in the Government of the Hong Kong Special Administrative Region ("Government") at the time of creation. To the extent that any such intellectual property rights may not be capable of being so vested in the Government, by submitting an essay, the entrant will also be regarded to have assigned to the Government the intellectual property rights of his/her submitted essay.
- 25. The Government, the DoJ and the Steering Committee on Mediation shall each have the right to use, publish, exhibit and publicize an entrant's essay in any media, in any manner and for any purpose they deem fit.

Personal data

- 26. Personal data collected in the Enrolment Form will be used only for the following purposes:-
 - (a) registration of the submission of the essays and verification of the eligibility of the entrants;
 - (b) correspondence with the entrants;
 - (c) announcement of the results of the Competition and award of the prizes relating to the Competition; and
 - (d) other purposes related to the Competition.
- 27. Entrants have the right to request access to and the correction of personal data as stated in the Enrolment Form in accordance with Sections 18 and 22 and Principle 6 of Schedule 1 to the Personal Data (Privacy) Ordinance (Chapter 486 of the laws of Hong Kong). Any such requests should be addressed to the Mediation Team, Department of Justice, 2nd Floor, Justice Place, 18 Lower Albert Road, Central, Hong Kong.

Other terms and conditions

- 28. By submitting an essay, an entrant is regarded to have agreed to be bound by these rules of the Competition and any decisions of the Panel. The DoJ reserves the right to interpret these rules of the Competition, and any such interpretation shall be final and conclusive. These rules of the Competition may be varied or amended without prior notice.
- 29. Each and every entrant agrees to indemnify and keep indemnified the Government (including the DoJ and the Education Bureau), all other co-organisers of the Competition and their respective employees, officers, directors, agents, representatives, successors,

advertising and promotional agencies from any liability for any loss or damage of any kind to any person arising out of or in connection with the Competition or participation in any related activities, including but not limited to the presentation or the publication of the essays and the sharing of his/her views at the award ceremony, to the fullest extent possible as permitted by law.
