Mediate First : With Great Dialogue Comes Great Understanding

Date: 9 May 2025 (Friday)
Venue: N101, Hong Kong Convention and Exhibition Centre

Synopsis: Under the theme “Mediate First: With Great Dialogue Comes Great Understanding”, the event aims to encourage the community to first explore the use of mediation as an effective and accessible tool for dispute resolution. The event will kick off with a Mediation Forum spanning the morning and the afternoon: the morning session will explore the Judiciary’s role in promoting mediation, and the afternoon session will include experience sharing from representatives of various government departments and stakeholders on how to deepen the mediation culture through different mediation schemes. Besides, students who have participated in the peer mediation training will, through a lively manner, showcase the role and advantages of mediation in resolving peer conflicts.

The event will culminate in a “Mediate First” Pledge Signing Ceremony, a Star Logo Awards Presentation Ceremony and a networking session. The event highlights the latest developments and achievements of the Judiciary, the Government, and stakeholders in deepening the mediation culture in Hong Kong.

The Judiciary launched its first voluntary mediation scheme in 2000 for matrimonial/family cases, with promising results. Since then, the Judiciary has explored numerous ADR mechanisms for handling various court cases, including Building Management, Compulsory Sales, Small Claims cases and District Court cases.</i> <i>With the concerted effort by all stakeholders, the foundation of family mediation has been well established in the Judiciary and the community as well. Family mediators embody the spirit of mediation by promoting understanding, respect, and cooperation among parties with disputes of divorce. Family mediators have long been placing the welfare of the children as their paramount concern throughout the mediation process. Family mediators also put great effort in enhancing the divorcing parties to engage into a peaceful and constructive dialogue and, most importantly, to maintain their roles of parent ensuring the growth of the children would not be jeopardized by the divorce.</i> <i>The Judiciary would like to take this opportunity to have family mediators and organizations from different sectors to share in this</i>
