







Investment Law & Investor-State Mediator Training

Date: 15 - 21 October 2018

Venue: The University of Hong Kong

Investor-State mediation has become an increasingly popular alternative to, if not substitute for, arbitration in resolving investment disputes. In some new treaties, mediation has been introduced as a pre-condition to commencement of investor-State arbitration.

The Department of Justice of the Hong Kong SAR, the International Centre for Settlement of Investment Disputes (ICSID) and Asian Academy of International Law are jointly organising a 7-day investment law and investor-State mediator training course in Hong Kong. World-renowned trainers have been invited to share their knowledge and expertise in international investment law and investor-State mediation. This is the first investor-State mediator training offered in Asia and should not be missed!

The first three days of the training course will focus on building up participants' knowledge in international investment law including the basic principles, topical issues raised in international investment disputes and dispute resolution process. It will then be followed by a four-day intensive training on international mediation training which cover considerations specific to investor-State mediation, inter-cultural competency, process design and conduct of an effective investor-State mediation, and ethical challenges, among other topics. Participants will also have an opportunity to participate in interactive role-playing sessions. The training course will be conducted in English.

Government officials and mediators who are interested in knowing more about investment law and investor-State mediation are invited to participate. Limited spaces. A tentative course programme is attached.
